Manual for the "The City of the Falling Star"




"The city of the falling star," where urban functions in harmony with nature create Japan's most comfortable place to live

The name "Kudamatsu" comes from the time of Empress Suiko, when the Great Star (also known as the North Star) is said to have fallen on a pine tree in Aoyaginoura, part of the villa belonging to the Washizu clan. The star shone there for seven days and seven nights, sparking a prophecy that a prince from Baekje would come to the land. Three years later, Prince Rinsho, considered the ancestor of the Ouchi clan that would subsequently rule Yamaguchi, came from Baekje (called "Kudara" in Japanese).

Because of this, "Hoshi ga kudatta matsu" ("the pine where the star fell") became "Kudari Matsu," then "Kudamatsu."

Another theory holds that Prince Rinsho visited to open trade with Baekje, and a mispronunciation of the word "Kudaratsu," meaning "port of commerce with Kudara," became "Kudamatsu." This then began to be written as it was pronounced.

These legends were passed down and live on in daily life, as Kudamatsu is known as "the city of the falling star."

Kudamatsu Town Center Kiraru

Kudamatsu Town Center Kiraru features a shopping mall where specialty shops with the necessities of daily life, like a grocery store, clothing shops, and variety stores, stand side by side. It also houses the community radio station Shunan FM, which transmits local information; a theater for enjoying the latest movies; a culture hall that hosts concerts and other events; and a health center. The complex represents Kudamatsu as a base for commerce, culture, and health.

Kudamatsu Kenko Park

Kudamatsu Kenko Park is a recreational complex to refresh the mind and body. There are ways to have fun unique to every season, regardless of the weather, like swimming in the indoor pool with adjoining water slide in summer or having an exhilarating skate on the indoor ice rink in winter. The park is also fully equipped with spacious natural hot spring baths and saunas to alleviate everyday tiredness, and a golf course where players can view the beautiful Seto Inland Sea.

Suetake Odori Line (Prefectural Route Kudamatsu Kano Line)

The entire route was opened in 1999. The area is also popular as a residential area because of its great convenience, thanks to the accumulation of institutions like large commercial facilities and hospitals.



Kudamatsu City Library

This library has an ample collection of over 250,000 books in various genres, including novels, history books, and children's books. You can also borrow and read e-books using the digital library system.



Takinokuchi Kasen Park

Enjoy the many facets of nature in all four seasons, like playing in the cool river in summer or taking in the picturesque foliage in fall. Another attraction is that it is close to the urban part of the city, so you can feel free to go whenever you want to refresh your spirit.



Kudamatsu Community Exchange Center

There is a cross-generational community space in Fukushi no Sato where anyone can feel free to gather, tailored to a wide variety of needs, including health promotion, hobby activities, community events, meetings, and training.



Hanaoka Rose Garden

A rose garden under the National Route 188 overpass. The local volunteer group the Hanaoka Rose Cultivation Association plants and grows approximately 400 roses of different varieties. The best times of year to visit are around May and October.



Kudamatsu Sports Park

A general sports park with facilities like a gymnasium available. Residents also know it as a place to jog or walk. It is also famous for its flowers, including weeping cherry trees and cosmos.



Kudamatsu Agricultural Park

A hands-on agricultural facility for studying the workings of nature and the importance of food. Many types of experiential projects are implemented to learn about the joys and fun of farming. The twice-yearly morning market bustles with people.



Kudamatsu Park

The park has a multipurpose square, tennis courts, and more. Visitors can enjoy a sweeping view of the city from Hoshi no To. People flock here in spring, when the cherry blossoms are in full bloom, as it is known as a famous spot for the flowers.



Koigahama Ryokuchi Park

A park with inclusive equipment, incorporating universal design so that all children can play safely, securely, and comfortably regardless of ability or disability. It will reopen in spring 2025.

EVENTS

Kudamatsu has events for experiencing traditions like festivals and performing arts in every season.

The Inaho Festival every November 3 is a whimsical event where a bride and groom in fox masks parade through the town with their companions in tow. This foxes' wedding draws a lively crowd of 30,000.

Kudamatsu Kasadojima Island Trail, a race through the scenic oceanside and mountains of Kasado Island, brings many runners from all over Japan and is a winter highlight in Kudamatsu.







Kasado Bridge

A spectacular road to access Kasado Island

Its beautiful crimson is well known as a symbol of Kudamatsu. Experience an unbroken view of the Seto Inland Sea from the bridge. The bridge lit by external lights reflects off the water surface at night to produce a fantastic atmosphere, revealing a completely different charm than in the day.



Hanaguri Swimming Beach

Enjoy marine activities with friends and family

A swimming beach with beautiful white sands and sparkling emerald sea. There are shallows where even small children can play safely, and rocky shores. Visitors can also fish.





Hanaguri Beach **Promenade on the Sea**

The invigorating feeling of walking on the sea

An approximately 300 m-long promenade undulating like waves stretches over the sea. A wide range of people visit to stroll while feeling the sea breeze, fish, or snap photos of the gorgeous view.





Island Schoolhouse

a facility exhibiting and storing local Kudamatsu artefacts

Visitors can learn about Kudamatsu's history and culture through exhibits of numerous earthenware artefacts excavated in the city, and archeological and folk materials related to local culture and industry.





Kasado Island Family Travel Village

Located on a hill overlooking Kasado Bay, it offers car campsites, cabins, and a barbecue garden. Enjoy the blue of the sea and sky in the daytime, the sunset sinking into the water in the evening, and the view of the illuminated industrial complex at night.

Access



Access by air

- Tokyo (Haneda) → Yamaguchi Ube Airport (Approx. 1 hour and 35 minutes)
 - → Approx. 1 hour by car from the airport
- Tokyo (Haneda) → Iwakuni Kintaikyo Airport (Approx. 1 hour and 30 minutes)
 - → Approx. 40 minutes by car from the airport



Access by ferry

- For people from Shikoku, Boyo Ferry provides services from the port of Mitsuhama (Matsuyama, Ehime) to the port of Yanai.
 (2 hours and 30 minutes' ferry ride)
- For people from the vicinity of Oita, Suonada Ferry offers services from the port of Taketatsu (Kunisaki, Oita) to the port of Tokuyama (2 hours' ferry ride)



Access by car

- Approx. 10 minutes from Tokuyama Higashi Exit on Sanyo Expressway
- Approx. 20 minutes from Kumage Exit on Sanyo Expressway
- O Approx. 40 minutes from the port of Yanai
- Approx. 15 minutes by taxi from Tokuyama Station
- Approx. 25 minutes by bus from Tokuyama Station



Access by train

Take JR Sanyo Shinkansen to Tokuyama Station and transfer to JR Sanyo Main Line. Get off at Kudamatsu Station.
